


Stan and Marsha Bullock recently relocated from Dekalb Co. to be close to their son Seth, and his family. Their other son, John and his family live in Oregon.

Florence Helen Nethery Duncan




Florence is pictured here with her 3 beautiful daughters and granddaughter !

Florence has been coming to Westminster for years, but has decided to officially transfer her membership from First Florence to WPC!

This article was in the newsletter a couple of years ago, but worth repeating today: The University of North Alabama has named its bachelor of science in nursing program for Florence Helen Nethery Duncan. Tera Kirkman, dean of the Anderson College of nursing said it is fitting that the bachelor's program is named after someone like Duncan. "It's an honor to name the college's oldest

program after Ms. Florence Helen Nethery Duncan. "Ms. Duncan exemplifies the qualities of a caring nurse and leader. She is a role model to current and future nurses and has served the profession faithfully." The people she served and cared for were right here in this community, and that's what makes this gift so special."

"My sisters and I are very proud of our Nethery family history in nursing that started with our grandmother, Thelma, who began her college education on the UNA campus over 100 years ago," said Jenny Duncan McKinney, the family spokesperson. "Our mother is connected to Florence and this University, having spent most of her nursing career working in Florence, particularly in geriatric nursing. Florence Helen Netherly Duncan said she was driven throughout her career as a nurse by the desire to help others and fulfill her calling. "I felt like I was doing to the best of my ability what I was born to do and what I was trained to do," Duncan said Friday during a ceremony at the Anderson College of Nursing and Health Professions. "Maybe they were right to call me Florence after all," she wrote.. Florence Nightingale was a great nurse, after all!



North Alabama Presbytery elected Rev. Bob Phelps to serve as Executive Presbyter in February, 2025. 

Goliath taunted Israel for 40 days. Day 41 came, and David slew him.


Jonah preached a message of repentance to Ninevah for 40 days. On day 41, God stopped His plan to destroy them.

5 runners 340 miles 48 hrs 37 mins!



In 2023, 1818 Farms was selected as one of the prestigious Good Housekeeping's 2023 Beauty Award winners, winning "Best Body Butter" for their coveted Shea Creme. The creme was applauded for its lightweight, "whipped" texture and moisturizing properties.
