Hope for All Hearts

Isaiah 9:6–7 announces a promise spoken 700 years before Jesus’ birth: a child who would be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. This Advent season, Christians around the world join the ancient prophets and the Magi in longing for this promised King—the one who would turn the world’s understanding of power upside down.

Isaiah’s words express the deep human ache we all know: the desire to be connected to the One who holds the world together. Scripture says God has “set eternity in the human heart.” We feel it whenever beauty stirs us—when a sunset moves us, when a story captures our imagination, when we long to step inside the goodness we glimpse. We don’t only want to observe beauty; we want to join it.

Advent tells us that God has answered that longing. The God outside of time stepped into time, entering history as a Middle Eastern peasant child—fragile, ordinary, easily overlooked. But in him, the fullness of God’s wisdom, strength, mercy, and peace draws near to each of us personally. All that he is, he is for us: our counselor when we are confused, our mighty God when we are powerless, our everlasting Father when we feel alone, our prince of peace when the world shakes.

Isaiah ends with this promise: “The zeal of the Lord will accomplish this.” God is not reluctant to love us; he is eager. Advent invites us to hope again, to look for Christ’s light warming our winters, and to remember that the King who once lay in a manger now dwells tenderly within us.






