




Marsha Bullock






World Communion Sunday is an annual celebration that originated in the Presbyterian Church and now has a place on many different Church calendars. Every year on the first Sunday in October, we not only gather at God's Table; we also celebrate the fact that people around the world, people who believe as we do and people who believe differently, people who call this celebration a Sacrament and people who call it something else, people who eat bread baked specially for this celebration and people who eat crumbled saltines—people of many different faith traditions gather at God's Table as it exists in their worship spaces and, hopefully, acknowledge that we all gather as one people in service to one God.

Some congregations made extra efforts to include multi-cultural elements in their liturgy yesterday. Others probably did what they always do, hopefully saying an extra few words in the Great Prayer of Thanksgiving about the special significance of the day. However we approached World Communion Sunday, God's call for unity always confronts us at that Table. Some of you may have sung the song, "One Bread, One Body." Whether you sang it or not, the Table is one of the places we have opportunity to demonstrate our oneness with God and with one another to the world.

I am grateful to be part of the PCUSA where everyone is welcome at God's Table every time it is set. I have had a few experiences with places where the Table is not open, and they are painful. I once attended a Catholic funeral in which we were told that Protestants were invited to remain in the pews and pray that someday Jesus might come to our hearts, too. Ouch! I have worshiped in other Catholic settings where I was welcomed as a family member, but I don't think anyone told the Bishop! I hope you left worship yesterday affirming oneness as a goal for all Christians.
